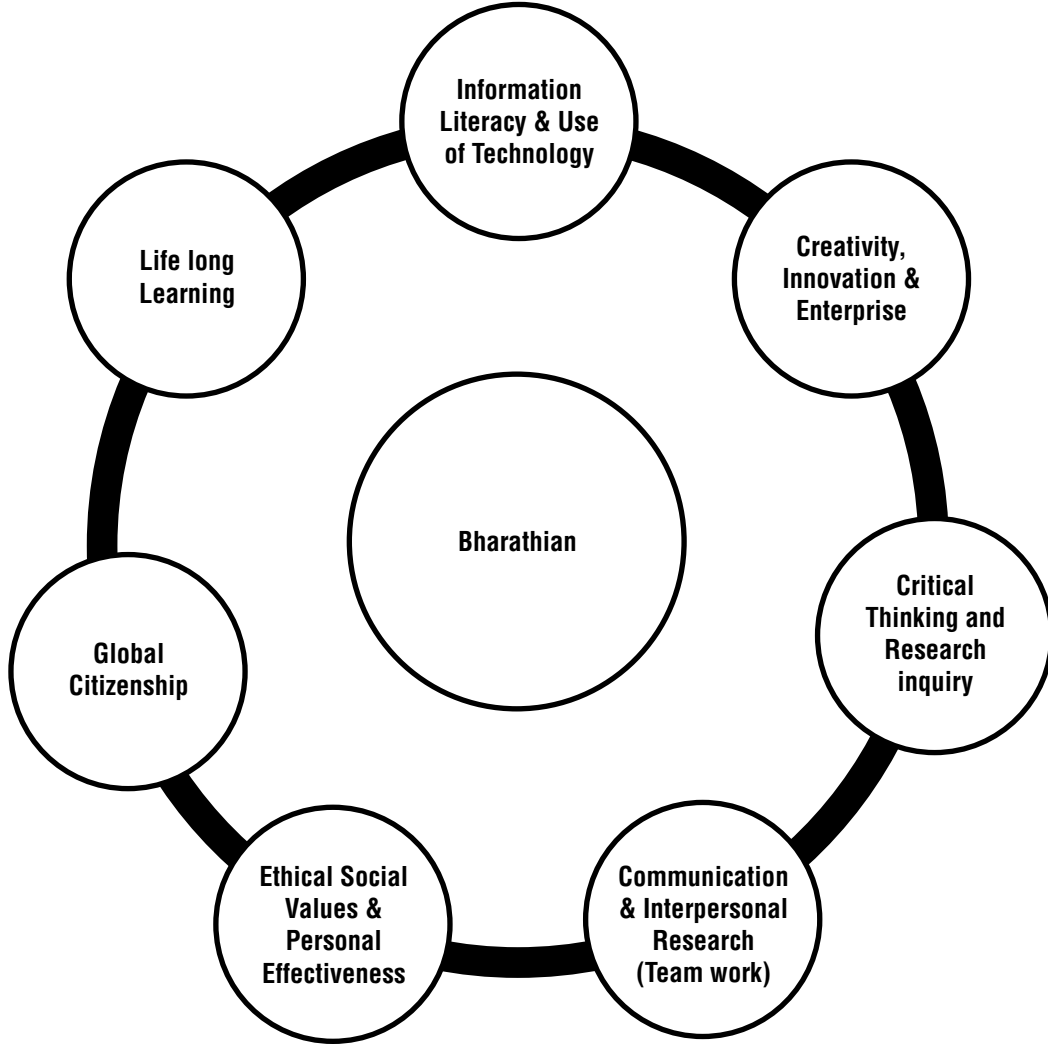

RASTRIYA UCHCHATAR SHIKSHA ABHIYAN (RUSA)

RUSA - PHASE I:

With the allocated fund of Rs.20 crore under Component 3 for Infrastructure development, Bharathiar University has improved the campus facilities by:

1. Construction of ladies hostel and sophisticated laboratory for housing high end equipments.
2. Construction of dining hall, II floor of Biotechnology, renovation of library.
3. Purchase of high end equipments for sports, Library, Computer facility and recombinant protein production Plant and language lab.
4. Solar Power Plant for electricity generation..

In addition, Rs.1 crore was sanctioned under Component 8 for Research and Innovation – Sustainable energy Technologies. As 1st instalment Rs.50 lakhs had been released to establish / purchase equipments for Solar Cell material characterization which is a state of art facility in Physics Department. Now, the Central and State Government has released an amount of Rs.25 lakhs as 2nd instalment.

1. BHARATHIAR ENTREPRENEURSHIP, INNOVATION AND CAREER HUB (BEICH) - Rs.15 crore and
2. BHARATHIAR CANCER THERANOSTICS RESEARCH CENTRE (BCTRC) - Rs.35 crore.

On 3rd Feb. 2019, our Honourable Prime Minister **Shri Narendra Modi** inaugurated the Entrepreneurship, Innovation and Career Hub - BEICH through digital launch from New Delhi.

BHARATHIAR ENTREPRENEURSHIP, INNOVATION AND CAREER HUB (BEICH) Rs.15 crore

Out of Rs. 15 crores under BEICH, Rs.7.5 crores was released by Central and State Government. In which -

- * 86 Projects were sanctioned and released under BEICH.
- * 77 Research fellows were awarded under BEICH.
- * 34 projects were sanctioned and released under SDC – BEICH.
- * Skill Development training for 8 Government colleges were successfully conducted under Entrepreneurship Centre.

Three Centres were established such as -

1. Entrepreneurship Centre
2. Incubation Centre
3. Skill Development Centre

* Various training programs were conducted under BEICH for the benefit of Students and Research Scholars of Bharathiar University. So far 20,600 students are trained in various domain skill and soft skills.

BHARATHIAR CANCER THERANOSTICS RESEARCH CENTRE (BCTRC) Rs. 35 CRORE.

A cancer research centre is BEING established, addressing the issue in a holistic manner involving experts from various fields. "Bharathiar Cancer Theranostics Research Centre", would be established with laboratories housing state of art facilities to undertake research on Cancer. The region enriched with unexplored traditional and tribal therapeutic methods is ideal for establishing the cancer research to tap the potential solutions for the disease. The research team has planned to focus the research on three major thrust areas of cancer :

- Societal relevance research to identify the magnitude of the disease and causes of treatment failure and remission of disease
- Diagnostics research group comprising of scientists from genomic and proteomic specialisation is aiming to determine an easy, rapid and early diagnostics techniques
- Research group under Therapeutics is striving to deliver a potent combinatorial therapeutic regimen for treatment of cancer

The Cancer Theranostics centre is planned to be established at an appropriate estimation of |Rs.35 crore.

Under this scheme, around 50 projects proposals which fall in line with the above mentioned three objectives have been selected and sanctioned with financial assistance to the tune of Rs.825 L. The remaining funds have been allocated for the establishment of the center. The proposals have been screened and approved by Research Advisory Committee constituted as per RUSA-MHRD regulations.

Outcome of the project

- The centre thus established would be a platform for the conglomeration of academicians, clinicians and patients in alleviating the societal threat.
- This centre in future would evolve as a potential molecular diagnostic centre for cancer extending the support to all hospitals and clinics in diagnosis.
- This centre would be a solution provider for the clinicians in treating the patients both in terms of treatment and counselling.
- This centre is aimed to emerge as a repository of prevalent cancer cell lines and a training centre for Animal Tissue Culture techniques.
- Documentation of the traditional and tribal medicines is a novel initiative taken up by the research groups which is the need of the hour.
- As a whole the project would find a solution for the existing cancer threat hanging over the society by addressing social relevance, providing suitable diagnostic procedures and effective treatment methodologies.
- This would improve the social health and economic status in Tamil Nadu

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) REGULATIONS

Each PG Programme has core, elective and supportive courses/papers with credits ranging from 2 to 5 depending on their lecture hours per week. While core paper is exclusively offered in the parent department, the supportive papers are offered only by other departments. The elective paper may be from their parent/other departments as well. All these courses/papers may/may not have practical training as decided by the programme committee.

Duration and Structure of the Programme

i) The minimum and maximum periods for the completion of a programme are given:

- ii) The minimum number of credits 90+2 is to be earned for the successful completion of the 2 year full time (e.g: M.Sc.) and 135 credits for 3 year full time (e.g.: M.C.A./M.Tech.) programmes, which should include a minimum number of credits for 6 from the supportive courses and 12 from the elective courses. At least one elective/supportive courses, must be opted in the first three semesters. The remaining 72 credits are allotted to core papers/courses offered by the parent departments. This includes theory, (covering Industry 4.0 and 5.0) practical and project. Normally the project is conducted in the 4th semester. As a special case, 72 credits may also include field trip or industrial visit. The curriculum also includes Value Added Course and Job Oriented Certificate Course which will come under the extra credit courses, but it is mandatory.
- iii) The MBA Programme which comes under AICTE norms however will have a minimum of 128 Credits (3200) for its successful completion. Keeping the diverse input of candidates in MBA, all elective courses are offered only in the III & IV semesters. Thus, core paper alone will be taught in the I and II semesters of MBA.

All the Students are required to complete online course offered by SWAYAM, MOOCS and NPTEL by the end of 3rd semester.

Outcome - Based Education (OBE) is followed. OBE is a student - centered teaching and learning methodology in which the course delivery and assessment are planned to achieve stated objectives and outcomes.

Semester-wise Registration

The student has to register for the opted courses/papers with the respective faculty, after due announcement of the prescribed dates at the commencement of each semester.

On joining the University, each student is assigned to a faculty adviser. The student can register for course(s) which he/she intends to take during a given semester on the basis of the programme for each

discipline as given in the course of the study bulletin and as per the advice given by his/her faculty adviser. The faculty adviser is expected to discuss with student and then decide the nature of the courses for which the students can register during the semester within the framework of the guidelines.

Procedure for Registration

The registration schedule is announced in advance by the Head of the Department. Students should contact the respective faculty adviser of their department for guidance and registration. The student adviser, on the instructions of HOD, can suggest possible elective/supportive course(s) for registration by the candidate. In any case, registration must be completed on or before the prescribed last date for registration. Students having outstanding dues to the institute or a hostel, shall not be permitted to register. Late registration may be permitted for certain period only, on valid reasons and on payment of a late registration fee prescribed from time to time by CBCS office. However, if a student fails to register during any semester, his/her studentship is liable to be cancelled.

COURSE WISE GRADING OF STUDENTS LETTER GRADES

In the new regulations from the year 2021-22, the internal and external examinations carry equal weightage (50:50). Passing minimum is 50% for both Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and the End Semester Examination (ESE).

RULES FOR PAYMENT OF FEE BY P.G.STUDENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY DEPARTMENTS

1. Last date for payment of tuition fee and other fee relating to second and further semesters will be as follows:
 - (a) Without fine up to 15 working days from the date of commencement of classes.
 - (b) With a fine of Rs.25/- per working day from the 16th working day from the date of commencement of classes, but on or before the 30th working day (fine shall be calculated from the 16th working day onwards)
2. Any P.G. student, who fails to pay the fee even with fine within the 30th working day from the date of commencement of classes, shall be removed from the rolls and her/his admission shall be cancelled. The Heads of Departments are authorized to issue the circulars relating to the removal of candidates from the nominal rolls. A copy of the circular shall be sent to the Registrar and Finance Officer for information. Those candidates shall apply for re-admission through the Head of the Department and if re-admitted, they have to pay the re-admission fee of Rs.1000/- along with a penalty of Rs.25/- per day from the 16th working day. List of candidates who have paid fee shall be maintained in the Departments with due entries about the receipt number, date of payment, amount paid etc, in the register provided by the Registrar.
3. The period of removal from the rolls will be treated as absent for calculating the percentage of attendance earned by the candidate in that semester. The list of candidates removed from the rolls shall be displayed on the Department Notice Board with copies to Registrar and Finance Officer.
4. An undertaking shall be given by such candidates that they will not repeat the same in future.
5. Re-admission will be considered only if the Head of the Department certifies that the student's conduct and progress is satisfactory and his/her attendance to class is regular.
6. The Re-admission of the candidate cannot be claimed as a matter of right as it is the discretion of the Registrar with the recommendation of the Head of the Department concerned.
7. The Heads of the Departments shall maintain a register styled "Fees Collection Register" separately for PG candidates.
8. The Heads of the Departments are responsible for supervising the payment of fees before the stipulated deadline.
9. The students, immediately after paying the fee, shall produce the receipt to the respective Heads of the Departments for making entries in the Department Fee Register.
10. The Heads of the Departments shall enter the receipt number, date of remittance of fee and amount paid by the students in the Department Fee Register.
11. The Registrar's Office shall send a circular to all the Heads of the Departments about the date of commencement of classes, last date for payment of fee etc, relating to PG students.

12. As soon as the last date prescribed for payment of fee relating to PG students expires, the candidates who haven't paid the fee before the given date shall be removed from the rolls, under intimation to the Registrar and shall not be permitted to attend the classes by the Head of the Department.
13. The tuition fee and other fee, once paid, shall not be refunded under any circumstances.
14. Any candidate who leaves the institution in the middle of the course/academic year cannot claim for refund of any portion of the fee paid already.
15. Fee must be paid through Bank of India Challan/DD. Out of 4 copies of the challan except Bank copy, the candidate should submit the department copy and finance section copy to the department and the student's copy must be kept safe by the student, since, it is the evidence for having paid the fee and shall be produced, to the HOD/University office, when requested; candidates failing to produce the challan may be directed to pay the fee again. Remittance of fee in any other mode is not accepted.
16. The University reserves the right to revise the rules and fee without any intimation.

RULES FOR PAYMENT OF FEE BY M.Phil. & Ph.D. SCHOLARS OF THE UNIVERSITY DEPARTMENTS

1. Last date for payment of tuition and other fee relating to each year after completion of one year of registration is as follows.
 - (a) Without fine: Upto 15 working days from the date of completion of each year.
 - (b) With a fine of Re.1/-per working day: From the 16th working days but before the 30th working days from the date of completion of each year.
2. Any Research scholar who fails to pay the fee on or before the 30th working day from the date of commencement of the registration year, as said above shall pay the fine as follows:

Date of Payment of Fee	Fine to be Collected
(a) On any day after the 30th working day during the second month from the date of commencement of registration year	(a) Rs.250/- (Consolidated) second month from the date of commencement of(including fine from 16" to 30 working day)registration year.
(b) On any day during the third month from the date of commencement of registration year	(b) Rs.500/- (Consolidated)(including fine from 16" to 30" working day)

3. Beyond three months and up to 6 months from the date of Registration Rs.1,000/- shall be levied as fine, after getting the approval from the Vice-Chancellor as a Special Case.
4. The registration of any scholar who fails to pay the fee within 6 months from the date of commencement of registration year shall summarily be cancelled and such candidates shall have to seek re-admission by applying for it in the regular application for admission.
5. Whenever a scholar registers for M.Phil. Full-Time/ Part-Time programme and is not able to submit his/her dissertation in the prescribed time, he/she shall obtain the permission of extension for submitting his/her dissertation. At that time, along with extension fee, an additional administration fee of Rs.250/- shall be paid in favour of the Registrar.
6. The Heads of the Departments shall maintain a register styled "Fee Collection Register" separately for M.Phil and Ph.D. Scholars.
7. The Heads of the Departments are responsible for supervising the payment of fees before the deadline.
8. The students, immediately after paying the fees, shall produce the receipt to the respective Heads of the Departments for making entries in the Department Fee Register.

FREE EDUCATION SCHEME

Bharathiar University has implemented free education scheme for poor and talented students from the academic year 2007-2008. Students desirous of joining various-graduate courses, can approach the affiliated colleges for admission. The colleges have been given 5% extra seats in each course for admitting talented and poor students under this scheme. The affiliated colleges have given their consent to admit students under "Free Education Scheme".

The University has implemented the scheme to ensure opportunities for the talented poor students in the Post-graduate courses offered in the University Departments for which the students can approach their respective Heads of the Department for admission under this scheme.

ELIGIBILITY

Merit-cum-economic status is the main criterion for the selection of the students. Preference will be given to those students who fall under the following categories.

- Parental Status : Orphan, Destitute, Single Parent, Son or Daughter of divorcees, Children supported by NGOs.
- Social Status : Community Rural/Urban.
- Economic Status : Income of the parent(s), guardian, property/assets of the family.
- Academic Status : Marks in S.S.L.C., +2, Under-Graduate Degree programme with consistent performance and extracurricular activities.

The prescribed application can be downloaded from the University website (www.b-u.ac.in) and the filled-in application shall be sent to the respective Principal of the affiliated college for admission in the college and the Head of the Department concerned for admission in the University Department, on or before the due date.

Those who are already admitted under this scheme in any one of the affiliated colleges of Bharathiar University are not eligible to apply for the courses offered in the University Departments.

Aseparate counselling will be conducted to select the students under this scheme.

QUOTA UNDER SPORTS AND PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED CATEGORIES

One seat each is reserved for permanently disabled candidates and sports persons for admission to each of the programmes offered by the University Departments.

Candidates seeking admission under physically challenged quota shall produce a Medical Certificate about his/her permanent physical disability by an orthopaedic surgeon who is in the rank of an Assistant Surgeon. The candidates under this category will be selected on the basis of his/her scoring in Tamilnadu Common Entrance Test and such candidates should be physically fit to undergo the course.

Candidates seeking admission under sports quota will be selected on the basis of their performance/representation at the following levels:

- Participation at the international level, the candidate should have been sponsored by a National organization.
- Participation at the National level, the candidate should have been sponsored by a State Organisation.
- Participation at the inter-University levels, the candidate should have been sponsored by a Zonal or District Association.
- Participation at the State Level, the candidate should have been sponsored by a Zonal or District Association.

The performance of the candidates in sports that are included in the All India inter-University Competitions alone will be considered. Sports like Rifle Shoots, Karate, Judo etc, will not be considered. Students seeking admission under sports quota should be below 25 years of age. The achievement of the candidates in sports during their UG course of study alone will be considered for selection.

RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS BY UNIVERSITY GRANTS COMMISSION

NATIONAL FELLOWSHIP FOR SCHEDULED CASTE CANDIDATES

The Rajiv Gandhi National Fellowship (RGNF) Scheme for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes is formulated and funded by Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment and Ministry of Tribal Affairs. The scheme is open to candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste & Scheduled Tribe who wish to pursue higher studies such as regular and Full-Time M. Phil./Ph. D. degree in Sciences, Humanities, Social Sciences and Engineering & Technology. There are 2000 slots for Scheduled Caste and 667 slots for Scheduled Tribe Candidates every year for all the subjects.

Target Group : Unemployed SC/ST Candidates who have passed the Post Graduate examination in the subject concerned and who desire to pursue full-time research without JRF of UGC-NET or UGC-CSIRNET.

Eligibility : The candidate should belong to SC/ST and should have passed the Post Graduate examination. The selection will be made on the basis of merit of the candidates.

MAULANA AZAD NATIONAL FELLOWSHIP FOR MINORITY STUDENTS

The Maulana Azad Fellowship for Minority Students is formulated and funded by the Ministry of Minority Affairs. The scheme is open to candidates who belong to any one of the Minority Communities, i.e., Muslim, Sikh, Parsi, Buddhist & Christian and wish to pursue higher studies such as regular and full time M.Phil./Ph.D. degree in Sciences, Humanities, Social Sciences and Engineering & Technology. There are 756 slots every year for all the subjects and 3% fellowships are reserved for Physically Challenged candidates belonging to Minority Community as per the provision laid down by the Government of India.

Target Group : The candidates belonging to one of the minority communities who have passed the Post-Graduate examination with minimum 50% marks in the subject concerned and who desires to pursue full time research without JRF of UGC-NET or UGC-CSIRNET.

Eligibility: : A candidate has to fulfill the following conditions to become eligible for the award of this fellowship:

- (i) He/She should belong to one of the minority communities - Muslim, Christian, Sikh, Buddhist and Parsi, notified under section 2 (c) of the National Commission for Minorities Act, 1992.
- (ii) He/She should submit the minority certificate on self - declaration basis on a non-judicial stamp paper of rupees ten, until the State Government / Union Territory Administration starts to issue the minority community certificate.

NATIONAL FELLOWSHIP FOR HIGHER EDUCATION TO SCHEDULED TRIBE STUDENTS

The National Fellowship Scheme for Scheduled Tribes which has been renamed as National Fellowship for Higher Education of ST Students is formulated and funded by Ministry of Tribal Affairs. The scheme is open to candidates who belong to Scheduled Tribe and are pursuing higher studies such as regular and full time M.Phil/Ph.D. degree in Sciences, Humanities, Social Sciences and Engineering & Technology. There are 750 slots for Scheduled Tribe candidates every year for all the subjects

- Eligibility** : The Fellowship will be available only to the ST candidates who fulfill the following conditions for the award.
- (i) The candidate belonging to ST should have passed the Post-Graduate examination for being eligible for the Fellowship.
 - (ii) The candidate must be registered for regular and full-time for M.Phil./Ph.D. course in any of the University Institute / Colleges recognized by U.G.C. under Section 2 of the UGC Act / ICAR by fulfilling conditions for admission of the concerned University Institute/ Colleges.
 - (iii) The students once considered eligible for the fellowship shall not be entitled for any other fellowship of the Centre or State Government for the same study

POST DOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP TO SCHEDULED CASTE/SCHEDULED TRIBE CANDIDATES

This scheme has been initiated keeping in view the social background of the candidates from the deprived section of the society and to provide them an opportunity to undertake advanced studies and research in Science, Engineering & Technology, Humanities and Social Sciences in Indian Universities / Institutions / Colleges. The objective of the scheme is to provide an opportunity to SC/ST candidates to undertake Post Doctoral research in Sciences, Engineering & Technology, Humanities and Social Sciences at Indian Universities/Institutions/Colleges.

Target Group : Unemployed candidates from the deprived section of the society with Ph.D. Degree and aptitude for research.

- Eligibility**
- (i) The Candidate must have a Doctorate degree in the relevant subject preferably with published research work to their credit.
 - (ii) Only Ph. D. awarded, unemployed candidates will be eligible for the award of Post Doctoral Fellowship.

- (iii) The upper age limit for male applicants is 50 years as on 1st July of the year of application, and 55 years in the case of female candidates.
- (iv) The candidates of SC/ST categories having 50% marks at UG level and 55% marks at PG level are eligible to apply under the scheme.
- (v) The Candidates who have already availed/availed Post Doctoral Fellowship under any other Post Doctoral Fellowship scheme will not be eligible for the Post Doctoral Fellowship to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe Candidates scheme.

POST DOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP TO WOMEN CANDIDATES

UGC has initiated a scheme for Post Doctoral Fellowship for women candidates who are unemployed and holding Ph. D. Degree in their respective subject areas with an aim of accelerating the talented instincts to carry out the advanced studies and research.

Target Group : Unemployed women with Ph. D. Degree and an aptitude for research.

- Eligibility:**
- (i) The candidate must have a Doctorate degree in the relevant subject preferably with published research work to their credit.
 - (ii) In case of general/open category, the candidates should have 55% marks at U.G. level and 60% of marks at P.G. level. For reserved categories (SC/ST/OBC/PH) the candidates should have 50% at U.G. level and 55% at P.G. level. The upper age limit is 55 years for the candidates belonging to general/open category and 60 years for the candidates belonging SC/ST/OBC/PH/Minority communities, as on 1st July on the year of application.

UGC - JUNIOR RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP IN SCIENCE, HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES

The Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) scheme of the University Grants Commission (UGC) is open to candidates who qualify the National Eligibility Testing (NET) of the UGC and the UGC-Concil of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) joint test. However, it must be noted that these are qualifying tests only and do not bestow a fellowship upon the candidate.

Target Group : Candidates who have qualified UGC NET or UGC-CSIRNET.

Eligibility: Candidates who have qualified in UGC NET or the UGC-CSIR NET. However, the selection for the JRF is made by the Universities/Institutions/Colleges.

Dr. D. S. KOTHARI POST DOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP IN SCIENCES

Post-Doctoral research is an important enabling step in grooming young researchers for launching an academic/research career. This is a transition phase from a largely supervisor-directed student at doctoral level to an independent researcher for leadership position, particularly in academia and offers a platform for transit into cross-disciplinary areas.

Eligibility :

- Candidates who have either received a Ph. D. degree or submitted their Ph. D. thesis are eligible to apply. When selected, those holding the Ph. D. degree will be directly awarded the name PDF. Those who have submitted their Ph. D. thesis may be awarded a 'bridging fellowship' (with marginally reduced stipend) until they are formally awarded the Ph. D. Degree.
- The fellowship is awarded on a yearly basis with renewal/termination clause on the basis of PDF mentor/peer group appraisal. The maximum duration of the PDF award would be 3 years. Candidates should give an undertaking while availing the award, along with endorsement from the research mentor, that they would stay in place for a minimum of six months.

COUNCIL OF SCIENTIFIC & INDUSTRIAL RESEARCH (CSIR)

Human Research Development Group

Senior Research Fellowship (SRF) will be awarded each year by CSIR directly to those possessing the following qualification and experience:

M.Sc./B.E./B.Tech. or equivalent degree with at least 55% marks and one publication in SCI journal and should have completed at least two years of post M.Sc./B.E./B.Tech. research experience:

(OR)

M.Tech./M.E. or equivalent degree in engineering/technology with at least 60% marks;

(OR)

M.B.B.S/B.D.S. or equivalent with at least 60% marks and one year internship;

(OR)

B.Pharm./B.V.Sc./B.Sc.(Ag) or equivalent degree with at least 55% marks and one publication in SCI Journal and should have completed at least three years research experience;

(OR)

M.Pharm./M.V.Sc./M.Sc.(Ag) or equivalent degree with at least 55% marks and one publication in SCI Journal and should have at least one year research experience.

DST-INSPIRE FELLOWSHIP FOR PURSUING Ph. D. DEGREE PROGRAMME

Department of Science and Technology (DST) proposes to have a highly productive and user friendly, electronic knowledge based software application that offers effective implementation of INSPIRE FELLOWSHIP.

Mode of application : Online

Selection Process

Two-tier selection process i.e., screening of eligible applications by an Internal Committee, followed by final selection through an Expert Committee. However, the selection process will be completed within 6 months from the date of application received at the DST and the result of the selection process will be communicated to the selected candidate and will also be uploaded in the Website: www.inspire-dst.gov.in.

Eligibility

- **INSPIRE Scholar** having secured minimum 65% marks in aggregate or equivalent CGPA at M.Sc. or Integrated M.S./M.Sc. course.
- **1st Rank Holders** at University Level Examination (not at Autonomous College level examination) of overall full time post-graduate program in Science Engineering / Technology / Agricultural Pharmacy/other Applied Science streams and undergraduate in Medicine i.e. M.B.B.S. However, University shall consider providing 1st Rank for a minimum batch size of 10 students in that University level examination with minimum aggregate of 60% marks of the entire course program. However, merely having the eligibility for the INSPIRE Fellowship will not guarantee the final offer of fellowship. Expert Committee will finally take decision on selection based on the research proposal of the fellow.

INDIAN COUNCIL OF SOCIAL SCIENCE RESEARCH (ICSSR) FELLOWSHIPS

(Senior Fellowships and Post-Doctoral Fellowships)

ICSSR invites proposals for Senior Fellowship and Post-Doctoral Fellowship every year. The research proposal may belong to any one of the social science disciplines or may be interdisciplinary in nature. The recognized disciplines are: (i) Sociology and Social Anthropology; (ii) Political Science/Public Administration and allied subject; (iii) Economics and allied subjects; (iv) International Studies; (v) Social Geography and Population Studies; (vi) Commerce and Management; (vii) Social Psychology and allied subjects; (viii) Education and allied subjects; (ix) Social Linguistics/Socio-Cultural and allied subjects (x) National Security & Strategic Studies; (xi) Other Interdisciplinary areas in Social Sciences and areas of its interface with other disciplines of research. Within the framework of Social Sciences, an effort is made to promote interdisciplinary studies.

- Post Doctoral Fellowships are awarded to scholars, preferably below the age of 50 years, who have shown significant competence in research work, have completed their Ph.D. in Social Sciences, and desire to work on approved research themes at institutions of excellence under the guidance of senior social scientists. The supervisor should not be superannuated and should be in employment at the affiliating institution or other academic Institution/University/ Colleges.

ICMR SENIOR RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP/RESEARCH ASSOCIATE

Senior Research Fellowships provide opportunities to bright young men and women to pursue research and training invariably leading to Ph.D/M.D etc., under experienced researchers/investigators of repute in the field of Biomedicine

Research Associateships are awarded to encourage young research workers who have good quality published work to their credit to pursue research work in Biomedicine on specific research programmes as Post Doctoral fellows.

Eligibility:

- Upper Age Limit for Senior Research Fellowship the upper age limit is 35 years.
- For Research Associateship the upper age limit is 40 years (in case of women candidate the upper age limit is relaxed by two years)

Qualification:

i) Senior Research Fellowships

M.Sc. (Life Sciences,) M.A. (Social Sciences), Master in Medical Social Work (M.S.W.) degree holders with two years research experience M.B.B.S./B.D.S./ M.V.Sc./M.Pharm. / M.E./ M.Tech. degree holders.

The department is engaging PG MA Career Guidance and 2 UG B.Voc programme namely Business Process and Data Analytics and Multimedia and Animation funded by UGC. The department has introduced 2 degree programme with TCS to the affiliated colleges namely BBA (BPM) and B.Com. (BPS) at present.

The department of Extension and Career Guidance has created a unique website entitled www.careersvarsity.com using HTML, ASP pages and flash. This site will be useful for the final year students (UG, PG, M.Phil. etc.) to get ready for placement and potential employers to select the right candidates and placement officers in colleges for resource support.

In addition, as the part of the extension activities, the department is organizing programmes like faculty development programme, placement, skill development programme and career readiness programme regularly for the faculty and the students of the University departments and affiliated colleges of Bharathiar University. So far the department has trained more than 4000 faculty members and placed more than 25,000 students in the reputed industries like Infosys, Cognizant, TCS, Wipro, HCL, banking sectors and more than 20,000 students have been trained under career readiness programme by the faculty members of the University. The department also organizes “Finishing Schools” and affirmative programme with the support of TCS, Infosys and other IT & ITeS Companies. EDUSAT CENTRE

EDUSAT Centre, functioning at Department of Educational Technology, facilitates the students from University departments and Affiliated colleges to participate in virtual classroom sessions organized by UGC-CEC and online courses conducted by IIRS-ISRO. EDUSAT is the first Indian satellite launched on 20th Sep. 2004 exclusively to serve the educational (school education and higher education) needs through digitally networked environment. Bharathiar University is one among the selected higher educational institutions in India to install Satellite Interactive Terminal (SIT) connected to EDUSAT by UGC-CEC. During 2007 to 2014, EDUSAT Centre of our University was coordinating to facilitate the students of University departments to participate in live virtual classrooms organized by UGC-CEC. The centre has an archive of more than 600 recorded video-based virtual classroom sessions on various subjects viz., Management, History, Economics, Statistics, Environmental Science, Remote Sensing, Political Science, Script Writing, etc.

The availability of internet and its affordable cost have motivated the functioning of EDUSAT activities from SITs to internet websites. Since 2016, our centre has coordinated 48 online certificate courses (weekly and monthly) and workshops organized by IIRS-ISRO through the internet-based learning management system, benefitting more than 300 participants from University departments and Affiliated colleges. In 2018, the coordinator of the centre has received the best coordinator award from IIRS-ISRO, Dehradun for co-ordinating the online courses since the inception of outreach online courses by IIRS during 2010. The centre maintains the archives of more than 200 recorded video sessions of these online courses in our department library. The schedule of the courses is regularly circulated to the faculty members of our University departments, to reach the students and research scholars.

MULTIMODAL MATERIAL PREPARATION CENTRE

Multimodal Material preparation center was established in the year 2013 on our campus and is facilitated by the Department of Social Work. The prime focus of the center is to achieve inclusive and sustainable development of persons with disabilities. In order to reduce the challenges of the disabled, the center helps the students with disabilities to understand the modern assistive devices, software, aids and appliances available for them. About 10 PCs were installed with advanced software for those with low vision, locomotor disabilities, cerebral palsy and visual and hearing impairment.

The Software includes JAWS Pro Talking Software, Talking Typing Tutorial Software, PacMate 20 Cell Braille Display, Index Basic D Braille Embosser, Duxbury DBT Win Braille Translation Software, MAGic Screen Magnification Software and Lucid Lad Dyslexia Screener Software. The center can be used by students of University departments and all affiliated colleges of Bharathiar University on all working days from 10.00 AM to 05.00 PM.

UNIVERSITY HOSTELS

The Bharathiar University was established at Coimbatore by the Government of Tamilnadu in February 1982 under the provision of the Bharathiar University Act 1981. University is located in the foothills of Western Ghats with lush green in 1000 acres of land. Walking through the Bharathiar University Hostel campus is a good experience. The hostel blocks together can house around 2000 plus students who stay on campus. This stately, elegant campus of 10 classic buildings, tree-lined walkways, and open grassy courtyards and is the top University in the state with a residential, self-contained campus. Girls and boys have separate blocks and each block has a fixed capacity. Boys hostel are located in the main campus and girl's hostel is located in the Residential campus. Out of 11 hostels, four for boys, four for girls, two for Research scholars and one International hostel for foreign students and Official Guests. The hostels are nestled in clean surroundings with open courtyards. There is also sufficient parking facility for bicycles and two wheelers. The Hostel campus design serves to strengthen the sense of community at the university, with the belief that the daily interactions of residential life increase the potential for learning. The hostel provides the students with daily newspapers and various magazines to make them aware of the daily happenings.

Equipments and amenities

University hostels are fully furnished with Cot, Purified hot and cold water, CCTV cameras, Solar Lights, Music System, Play Grounds, Gardens and Bore Wells. The Napkin Vending & Incinerator Machines are available in the girls hostel. Hostels are equipped with Garden chairs and Visitor Waiting hall for parents, offering students a clean, comfortable and homely environment. A spacious common room offers computers, LED TV and other entertainment facilities to students. Guided study hour is maintained neat and hygienic. Guest rooms for visiting parents of students are also available. The hostel complex houses small utility shops like stationery, bakery, laundry, and Saloon. In addition, each hostel is blessed with an experienced supervisor who ensures special care to the students.

Mess

Each hostel has its own dining mess, where breakfast, lunch and dinner is served for students. The mess is run by the student's representatives under the control of warden. The dividing system is followed to meet the expenditure pertaining to the mess. Mess charges will be around Rs.50 to 80 per day. Every month a student has to pay the charge ranging from Rs.1500/- to 2,400/- as mess bill in total. Residents going out of station for more than Four days should apply for reduction in prescribed form to the supervisor at least one day in advance. Purified water from Reverse Osmosis plant is utilized for cooking and drinking. Hot water is also provided for drinking and bathing purposes. Also, FSSAI certificate was obtained for hostel mess from Tamilnadu food safety and drug administration department.

Rooms

In all hostels every room is occupied by two to three students except Research scholar hostel. Each student pays Rs.210/- per month as room rent besides electric bill and water charges. Refundable caution deposit Rs. 8,710/- will be collected from the students.

International Hostel

International Hostel is located in the university residential campus near children's park. Here the rooms are provided with a bed, mattress, desk, chair and cupboard for each student. Adequate dining facility is available for all students. Indoor game facilities for Table tennis, Badminton, Chess and Carrom board is available in the hostel. The hostel is provided with uninterrupted electricity, geyser facility, water cooler, common TV room and a common reading room. There are 45 furnished double bed rooms with attached toilet available to accommodate the foreign students, University examiners, distance education students, parents of the students and guests. The amount for accommodation is Rs.300/- for University examiners / official guest and Rs.350/- for Private Guests (recommended by University faculties and non-teaching staff) with production of ID card. For A/C rooms, a sum of Rs.100/ per person/ per day is charged in addition to the above mentioned accommodation charges

Sports facilities

Students having passion for sports and who like to maintain a healthy lifestyle will be impressed with the facilities at Bharathiar University hostel. Outdoor facilities is protected with green PVC coated fencing with retaining wall & flood lights to all hostels grounds Volleyball, Badminton, Kabaddi, Cricket, open courtyards for walking and Indoor facilities with Badminton Table Tennis, Chess and Carrom. The University Organizes an Inter- house competition for each hostel and Inter-hostel to all boys and girls hostels every year. The authorities are appointed taking additional charge for hostel sports and ground maintenance from the department of physical education for the hostel sports activities.

Security System

Complete safety and security inside the hostels and on campus is ensured by block supervisors, Wardens and Chief Warden and by the security staff and the Chief security officers on campus.

Medical facilities

University Hospital functions for the welfare of students in the University campus. The University hospital doctor will provide basic treatments for all the students of University and also for the staff in the University. A Pharmacy is also available in hospital to provide medicine for required persons. The University provides 24 hours ambulance facility, well equipped first aid centre under the care of a trained nurse. Emergency and major medical facilities are being arranged by the University hospital Doctors in nearby hospitals. Moreover as precautionary measure, fogging machine is used at regular intervals in all hostels to control the mosquitoes in the campus area.

Gardens

University garden has the ideal climatic conditions for good growing of Lawns and flowers, to ensure stress reduction of students. The gardens in the hostels have different types of trees, lawns and flowering plants like Rose, Water Lilly, Nerium, Hibiscus, Allamonda, Vinca, Roselia, Crotons and ground covers Verbena. Garden chairs are placed in various places for the convenience of the students. The garden is visited by thousands of students and public throughout the year.

Excellence in Hostel Life

It is needless to say that, hostel life has certain great attractions in spite of the freedom enjoyed by students they have to abide by the rules of the hostel. Hostel life provides a care-free atmosphere. The usual domestic life has plenty of responsibilities and annoyances. Life in a hostel is community life. Students live together, as a family. In certain hostels two or more Students are accommodated in a room. In the same way they eat together at the dining time and go out together for entertainment, recreation or other purposes. Hostel life has a charm of its own. However some basic etiquette can make the hostel life a memorable experience.

Hostel Authorities

Bharathiar University has a separate hostel section under the management of the Hostel Management Committee, headed by the Vice-Chancellor. The Chief Warden, Bharathiar University, also the secretary of the Committee, administers the daily hostel management. The hostel wardens are teaching faculty and are responsible for their hostel accounts, discipline, maintenance, allotment of rooms and other help a student may need. The mess is run by the student's representatives under the control of warden. The dividing system is followed to meet the expenditure pertaining to the mess.

UGC-HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

The UGC-Human Resource Development Centre (formerly Academic Staff College) was established in the year 1987 with 100 percent financial assistance from the University Grants Commission. It has conducted 126 Orientation programmes and 4 Faculty Induction Programmes (Instead of Orientation of Programmmges) for the benefit of nearly 4,650 Higher Education faculties since 1987. And 10,680 teachers benefited from 329 Refresher Courses conducted by our UGC-Human Resource Development Centre in various disciplines such as Arts, Science, Humanities, Social Sciences, Commerce, Languages, etc., More than 16,650 College and University teachers were trained by our UGC-Human Resource Development Centre, Bharathiar University.

Moreover, 89 other Special Programmes and Workshops were conducted by the UGC-Human Resource Development Centre. Computer Training, Training on Functional English, Office Automation, Accounting Procedures, Service Procedures to the Administrative Staff of this University, Training for Librarians, short term and interaction programmes for the scholars and Workshop for College Principals were included in the special programmes. It has also conducted Orientation Courses for the Engineering College teachers with financial assistance from AICTE. Two Workshops were organized for 150 Research guides and Supervisors. It paved way for learning the methods of research in Science and Social science. Interaction Programmes were conducted for Ph.D. Scholars benefiting about 600 of them through the UGC-Human Resource Development Centre, Bharathiar University.

The aims of UGC-Human Resource Development Centre, Bharathiar University to maintain the top most status at the National level, not only in terms of number of programmes organized, but also in terms of quality and variety. To accomplish this task, training in Infflibnet-Infonet, EDUSAT exposure, e-learning and e-content development are also provided.

Apart from the academic side, the HRDC has jointly organized the National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content (N-LIST) programme funded by the MHRD, New Delhi with co-ordination of the Information and Library Network Centre (an Autonomous Inter-University Centre of UGC), Ahmedabad for the benefit of Librarians of the Colleges and Universities. It has also conducted a programme for non-teaching staff members of CTI (Central Training Institute), Chennai and Mumbai with the sponsorship of CTI.

The UGC-Human Resource Development Centre Guest House has 25 rooms with attached bathroom facilities and also two dormitories with toilet facilities to accommodate more participants. Common facilities like waiting hall and TV room, Recreation hall, Reception Hall, Play Ground, Kitchen and Dining room facilities are also available in the guest house.

National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Bangalore reviewed the performance of all the Human Resource Development Centres in the country during February & March 2012. It made a detailed assessment of the curriculum, teaching Methods, infrastructure facilities and other innovative practices of all the Human Resource Development Centres in the country. The NAAC has rated the Centre with 55 marks, and UGC - Human Resource Development Centre, Bharathiar University is placed 12th at the National level among 66 ASCs and UGC- Human Resource Development Centre, placed 1st among the four ASCs functioning in Tamil Nadu State.

In the Academic year 2020-21, 4 Faculty Induction programmes, 11 Refresher courses, 4 Short term courses and 3 Workshops were approved by the UGC. The Human Resource Development Centre, Bharathiar University has successfully conducted all the programmes sanctioned during the academic year 2020-21 through online mode to the fullest satisfaction of the stakeholders.

Training Aspects

It has the facilities of Computers for offering hands-on training on e-Content preparation and SPSS package. It has library stack of 3800 books for the benefit of the participants of programmes of Orientation and Refresher courses. (Innovative pedagogical techniques with a focus on the Orientation Programme and Refresher Courses.) Resource persons are invited from Abroad, Central Universities and Stated Universities. All the available resources are invoked in support of the Human Resource Development Centre in the University.

SCHOOL OF DISTANCE EDUCATION

The School of Distance Education was established during the Academic Year 1991-92 and Distance Education Council (DEC) has provisionally recognized all courses conducted by SDE vide letter 'F.No.DEC/9909/2009/dt.17.12.2009. The School has limited its operation for the obvious reason of strengthening its base to provide quality in education. Having realized the objective, the School has started extending its action by identifying and approving Learner Support Centres within Tamil Nadu to help achieve higher gross enrolment ratio and higher literacy rate, which comprises the following functional Centres, viz.,

- I. Centre for Conventional Distance Education Programmes (CCDEP)
- II. Centre for Participatory Programme and Online Programme (CPP & COP)
- III. Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (BU-ICAI)
- IV. Department of Education
- V. Centre for Collaboration of Industry and Institution (CCII)

I. Centre for Conventional Distance Education Programmes (CCDEP)

The Centre for Conventional Distance Education Programmes offers innovatively-designed, need-based career relevant and job oriented programmes to meet the diverse demands of the Industry and the employers and more particularly to make the learners self-employable.

Admissions are made during the months of June to May for Academic Year batch and January to December for Calendar Year batch. For the Calendar Year, the number of courses offered is restricted. The Prospectus and application form can be obtained from

25% tuition fee concession has been provided to teachers, ex-service, defence, police personnel, RIF/CRPF personnel, press and media persons and graduates of Bharathiar University, 10% of fee concession has been provided to all women candidates who do not get any of the above concessions. Tuition fee is completely waived for physically challenged students. Personal Contact Programme (PCP) is conducted in all learning centres. Examinations are conducted twice in a year on scheduled dates. The CCDEP provides self-instructional study materials with CDs for all courses.

II. Centre for Participatory and Online Programmes (CPP & COP)

Participatory programme is an indigenous concept developed by Bharathiar University wherein colleges and institutions with facilities and faculty are identified throughout India and approved as partners of

Bharathiar University to offer various face to face weekend Programmes helping to achieve higher gross enrollment ratio and higher literacy rate but without compromising on the standard of education imparted.

Objectives:

- i. To provide an opportunity for the deprived students to enroll in a programme of their choice.
- ii. To provide an opportunity for those students enrolled for a regular programme in a college to concurrently register for another programme of their choice and acquire dual degrees in the same duration of study.
- iii. To provide opportunity for those students who wish to acquire more knowledge in a specific area of study by registering for the concurrent Diploma or PG Diploma.
- iv. To provide quality education for those who could not enroll for regular programmes in educational institutions.
- v. To provide an opportunity to utilize physical facilities, human resources and knowledge resources available in educational institutions to maximize knowledge disbursement.
- vi. To provide an opportunity for institutionalized education to the deprived.
- vii. To maximize the value of degree awarded by exposing to every area of academic environment available to regular students.

Objectives of Online Programmes:

Bharathiar University has proposed to introduce online courses especially for those who are employed in software industries and other industries where computer and internet facilities are available, but wish to have an adequate and continuous information source can enrich their knowledge and meet the expectations of the employers. Even housewives and those who wish to become graduates and post graduates can enroll and accomplish their goals effectively with dignity. The programmes are also suitable for the physically handicapped. Bharathiar University does this with the sole objective of achieving higher gross enrollment ratio and higher literacy rate.

III. Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (BU-ICAI)

The School of Distance Education offers B.Com.BBA.M.Com, and MBA Programmes to Auditors as collaborative programmes with ICAI from the academic year 2009-2010.

IV. Department of Education

The School of Distance Education offers B.Ed. Programme in distance mode from 2009-2010 onwards with the approval of NCTE and the Department of Education was instituted for the purpose.

BHARATHIAR UNIVERSITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE CONSULTANCY CENTRE (BU-CCCC)

Bharathiar University launched the Community College system in April 2007 and institutionalized the same as a statutory institution, named Bharathiar University Community College Consultancy Centre BU-(CCCC). The vision of the community college is to empower the disadvantaged and the underprivileged through skill development programmes and make them gainfully employed. It mainly concentrates on the urban poor, rural poor, tribal poor and women.

The Government of Tamil Nadu through its order No.163, HE (K2) Dept. dt. 22.5.2008 and other orders have time and again encouraged initiating the Community college system in Tamil Nadu. Similarly, this system of education has also been included in the X and the XI Five Year Plans by the Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India, New Delhi.

A Non-commercial, Non-profit making and service-minded organization can alone start and run the Community College. The Community College can be a Multi campus reality offering only skill based certificate and diploma programmes.

In order to rope in the disadvantaged persons, the Community College system envisages access, flexibility in curriculum and teaching methodology with cost effectiveness. The curriculum is designed to strengthen Life Skills, Work Skills, Internship and Preparation for employment.

Bharathiar University Community College is one among the best Community College streams of Indian Universities to offer around 47 Diploma programmes and two Certificate courses. A pass in 10th standard is the eligibility. At present there are 34 approved Community Colleges under Bharathiar University. Initiatives are being taken to give approval to the well established, renowned and service oriented trusts, societies and educational institutions, which are involved in education service for a minimum of five years to train the marginalized youth and deserving persons to become skilled and employable. SWAYAM

The Bharathiar University has successfully implemented SWAYAM in the University Departments as well as in the colleges affiliated to the University since 2018. The SWAYAM team of the University constantly coordinates with the University Departments and Colleges on one side and the UGC and Consortium for Educational Communication (CEC), New Delhi, on the other. Every College and University Department has a SWAYAM mentor. The SWAYAM mentors are actively involved in the implementation of SWAYAM on the campus. They popularize the SWAYAM courses offered in each semester, encourage enrolment, and monitor the progress of the students pursuing SWAYAM MOOCs. Faculty members of the University Departments and the affiliated colleges are also actively involved in developing SWAYAM MOOCs. In the first year of its implementation, 17DD free dish TVs have been installed in the University campus, and 39 DD free dish TVs are also installed in the colleges with more free dish being installed across various colleges presently. The University encourages students to take SWAYAM MOOCs for additional credits. The University periodically organizes workshops and webinars to orient faculty members and SWAYAM Mentors on SWAYAM.

DST-PURSE (Phase-II)

Based on publication output in SCOPUS International database for a 10-year period and in appreciation of the R&D Contributions, with h-index of 51, the Departments of Science and Technology, Government of India has granted Rs.17.5 Crores to Bharathiar University under the PROMOTION OF UNIVERSITY RESEARCH AND SCIENTIFIC EXCELLENCE (PURSE) initiative in the second phase. Earlier, Bharathiar University was allotted an amount of Rs. 9 Crores in the first phase. 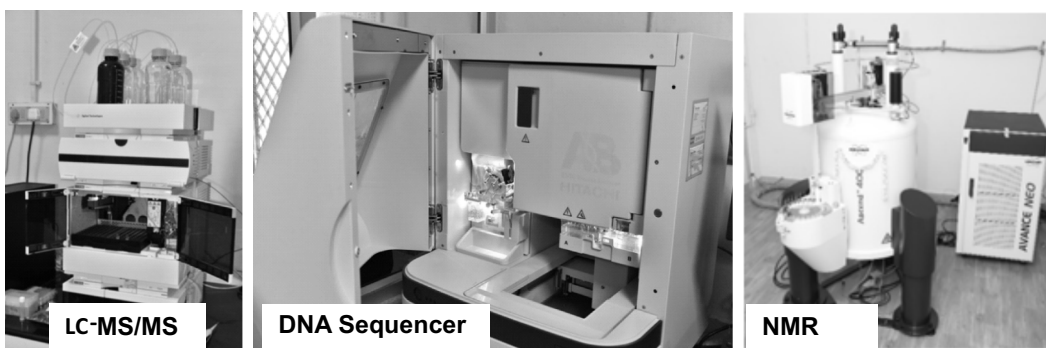

Major quantum of this grant is being utilized/will be used to procure state of the art sophisticated and advanced research instruments. Besides the equipment, the grant is being utilized for manpower training, to organize scientific meetings and for maintaining the facilities to be created. From the 1st year grant, major equipment's like i) LC-MS ii) NMR iii) DNA were procured. 5 National level meetings were organized.



Further, from the grant, campus-wide networking and Wi-Fi facility have been established which provides new single login access for the entire campus including administrative and academic buildings, the Master's students, research scholars, faculty, and administrative staff members. Apart from the Wi-Fi facility, a hardware firewall is also established for safe networking.

After the successful completion of the first year fund, DST released the second year fund; From the second-year grant, two major equipments i) HR-TEM and ii) Confocal Microscope are under procurement stage. 22 workshops were organized using the released grant. An annual maintenance contract was entered into for the major equipment procured in the first phase with this support. 30 research students from all the science departments are supported with a fellowship under this scheme and further, they were supported for their travel expenses to present their work at National level meetings.

UGC-HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT CENTRE (GUEST HOUSE)

The Estate Maintenance section of Bharathiar University is headed by the University Engineer in the cadre of Executive Engineer. The functions of the Estate Maintenance Office are as follows.

The construction and maintenance works upto Rs.10.00 lakh in the Academic buildings, Residential quarters, Guest House, Hostels and Maintenance of road, water supply and Electrical installations and Generator in H.T points I and II are being executed by this section. Further the maintenance of building in the Constituent colleges at Sivagiri, Thondamuthur, Pollachi and PG centre at Erode are also come under the purview of this section.

The building works (Civil and Electrical), maintenance and repairs, additions and alterations, Garden maintenance, providing furniture for various departments, improvement works both Civil and Electrical are executed based on the funds allotted in the budget estimate.

The major construction works for a value of Rs.3029.22 lakh entrusted to PWD, Technical Education Division, Coimbatore as deposit works are completed during the calendar year 2020 and works to the tune of Rs.1595.00 lakh are in progress. Apart from this, building projects announced by the Government of Tamil Nadu and proposals funded by RUSA under MHRD are also executed through Technical Education Division of Public Works Department in co-ordination with the Estate Maintenance Office.

Besides this, purchase of furniture for the laboratories, Departments, class rooms, Offices, Hostels and Constituent colleges are being looked after by this wing as per rules and regulation of this University.

The Horticulture Officer and Farm Officer in this Section are looking after the maintenance of lawns, gardens in the campus and coconut farm with the assistance of gardeners.

The Sergeant of this section is looking after the house keeping work in all the department buildings, Administrative buildings and the campus with the assistance of Sweepers and Scavengers. The security service of the campus is also looked after with the assistance of security personnel.

ROADMAP FOR EDUCATION 4.0 AND 5.0

The fifth industrial revolution, Industry 5.0 is changing the world around us. Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning, Automation and Robotics, Big Data, Internet of Things and Augmented Reality & Virtual Reality and Creativity are the tools of Industry 4.0. Industry 5.0 will bring a human touch to the manufacturing domain which in turn will see more improved collaboration between smart systems and humans which would result in the merging of the critical and cognitive thinking abilities of humans with the highly accurate and fast industrial automation. The fourth and fifth industrial revolutions are affecting the roles that Indian Universities and Colleges prepare students for, and educational institutions are ideally placed to help produce the workforce for this new world and the student experience to match it.

Bharathiar University has designed guidelines for Curriculum 4.0 and is preparing new syllabi for all subjects intertwining Industry 4.0 and 5.0 tools onto various disciplines such as Science, Social Science, Arts and Education. Bharathiar University has identified the gap in knowledge resources such as books, course materials, interdisciplinary curriculum and innovative programmes. To fill this gap and to prepare the future pillars of our Globe to face the Volatile, Uncertain, Complex and Ambiguous (VUCA) world, and to help the academic community, Bharathiar University is seriously preparing Guidelines for revising the syllabus, designing innovative Faculty Development Programs, establishing connectivity to the real world for students, incubating creativity and design thinking, and editing interdisciplinary Books for Education 4.0 and 5.0 with active participation of all stakeholders under the esteemed leadership of the Honourable Vice-Chancellor, Prof. P. Kaliraj.

Roadmap to innovate Education in the era of Industry 4.0 and 5.0

The fifth industrial revolution, Industry 5.0 is already on the verge of changing the world we live. Industry 5.0 is the future, but an already penetrating trend, of change processes directed towards closer cooperation between man and machine, and systematic prevention of waste and wasting including Industrial upcycling. Technology-wise, evolution of 5G and Quantum Computing will play significant roles in achieving the speed factor along with Industrial innovations in Energy Production, Distribution, and Consumption.

From an educational perspective, linking Industry 4.0 and 5.0 with Arts and Science education is the need of the hour. A roadmap to innovate Education in the era of Industry 4.0 and 5.0 and to align education with industry 4.0 and 5.0 has been prepared by Bharathiar University to achieve excellence in teaching, learning and research. Based on the perspectives such as curriculum, research, students, faculty, infrastructure and internationalisation, an action plan has been designed and developed. It is necessary to upgrade the educational curriculum today to match the features of Industry 4.0 and 5.0. In other words, it is to bring the quality and cream of industry 4.0 and 5.0 into education, which is really to merge the power of automation with creative, cognitive and critical thinking abilities of both Arts and Science students. This is never meant only to Science and Technology students as it was once, but rather focuses on how the power of automation can be applied to the subjects of Social Science, Commerce, History, Economics, Languages, Management, Healthcare, Nursing, Music, Arts and Civil Service and how can the cognitive and creative abilities of these students also be brought out so that they are able to find jobs and live successfully.

Curriculum 4.0 and 5.0

Innovating the education to align with Industry 4.0 and 5.0 requires the curriculum to be revisited, the faculty need to be given training and the students should have more access to sustainable and quality knowledge which would help them to face the demands of future. Another important area where

innovation is required is the research work carried out by universities and institutions so that innovative, creative and useful products and services are made available to the society through translational research. Bharathiar University is preparing the guidelines for incorporating Industry 4.0 tools across various disciplines of Arts, Science and Social Science Education. It is important to equip the learners with the basic operating technological skills required for Industry 4.0 and 5.0. All the technologies run through the fuel of data which is an important component to drive the insights, solutions and challenges. Digital content development will be the key for future education which may be through online mode. Bharathiar University is initiating the new programmes - M.Sc. Medical Biotechnology, M.Sc. Cyber Security, PGDCA Cognitive Systems from the academic year 2020 - 2021.

Industry infusion into curriculum is very important since students are to be prepared for jobs in an industry that is revolutionized with the fourth wave of digital technology and is going to be in its next version of 5.0. To achieve this, the curriculum is prepared in such a way that more industry experts are involved and R&D managers, product development managers, technical managers are invited as special invitees to the Board of Studies of each programme. The curriculum gives space for innovative learning pathways such that the traditional classroom mode of teaching and learning will change to innovative methods like experiential learning, flipped classrooms and blended learning. Experiential learning will involve case-study based approach, problem solving approach and team based project work. Industrial visits will also be planned so that students get a firsthand information about an industry atmosphere, internships will be promoted and field based training and projects will be given more emphasis. There will be an increased usage of Information Communication Technology tools.

Internationalisation

Academic tie-ups and collaborations with foreign universities and institutions foster quality education taking education to a higher level. Bharathiar University has initiated discussions with University of Melbourne, Australia for a collaborative MBA Executive programme.

CENTRAL INSTRUMENTATION CENTRE



The central instrumentation centre functions from the recently constructed state-of-the-art building on two floors with an approximate area of 36000 sq. ft. The major and common research facilities are/ will be housed which will cater to the research needs of researchers of Bharathiar University and affiliated institutions and other researchers across the country. Presently, the major equipments procured through DST-PURSE (Phase-II) grants are being housed at Central Instrumentation Centre.

The following facilities are established at this centre and available for research use.

1. Multiprobe Nuclear Magnetic Resonance Spectrometer (400 MHz)
2. Genetic analyzer 8 capillary - Sanger DNA Sequencer



The following facilities will be established soon at this centre

1. Liquid Chromatograph - MS - MS
2. HR - Transmission Electron Microscope (200 kV)
3. Laser scanning advance confocal microscope multi photon.

The available facilities are mapped in the portal of the "Indian Science Technology and Engineering Facilities Map (I-STEM): The I-Stem facilitate web-access to the scientific community with available resources in various organizations across the country in a transparent and systematic manner.

The coordinator of the central instrumentation centre, as an Institution representative for I-Stem activities of Bharathiar University will update and maintain institution profile, Registration of Equipment, Updation of equipment information, Equipment User Fee, Equipment Calendar, Customize Service Request form, and to create other Department Representative, Facility Coordinator, etc. in the I-Stem Portal.

With the support of grants under DST-PURSE (Phase-II), three events were organized at CIC.

- 1) Two- day Hands-on training for experimental liquid state NMR
- 2) Two-days Hands-on Training Program on DNA Sequencing Facility
- 3) Awareness of I-STEM portal for Use of the R & D resources

ENTERPRISE RESOURCE PLANNING SYSTEM (ERP)

Government of Tamil Nadu in response to the demand of Higher Education sanctioned and announced that Bharathiar University will implement Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) in order to provide an integration of data (G.O. Ms. No. 7 dated 06.01.2020). The Government has accorded administrative sanction for a sum of Rs. 1,15,00,000/- (Rupees One Crore Fifteen Lakh Only) for the implementation of ERP in Bharathiar University, Coimbatore.

Bharathiar University is a higher education institution and is deemed to have a unique organizational model and core processes compared to other institutions in various sectors. ERP system for an institution smoothly incorporates computer-based application which is used to operate external and internal resources, including materials, tangible assets, human and financial resources together with covering all the features and processes of an institution. University has various functional units such as Registrar's Office, Finance Office, Controller of Examinations Office and Academic Departments. Academic and administrative Information in Bharathiar university and its affiliated colleges are acquired and stored through six university administrative sections such as sections, A, B, C, E, G and S. Most of the information is maintained in standalone machines where information accessibility and retrieval can be possible only from the standalone system since there is no distributed system for data management. Most of these data are maintained in Microsoft Access data base with query based retrieval system. As there is redundancy in data storage and updation of data is not centralized, there are opportunities for data mismatch, data anomaly, and difficulty in consolidation of data. Establishing ERP will be more effective in data accessing especially in student information management system, faculty information management system, college information system, administrative data system, distance education information management system and also for other data analysis and decision making. Implementation of ERP system can help in improving the efficiency and effectiveness of various education processes and enhance stakeholders and student-centric related services. ERP enables to adopt multi-disciplinary management approach considering all the aspects relating to operational, financial, materials, behavioural, organizational practices and policies, and computer related issues. It will help the University for effective data management, timely information delivery and decision-making.

ONLINE ADMISSION PROCESS AT THE BHARATHIAR UNIVERSITY TO MAINTAIN TRANSPARENCY

The online admission portal of Bharathiar University, Coimbatore, has been developed and implemented successfully to maintain transparency for the admission for July 2020 - 21 academic batch. The process of admission portal starts with aspiring candidate's registration to various programmes with the necessary details and application fee payment as per the guidelines and procedure. If a candidate is interested in transferring the application from one department to another department after submitting the application, the candidate can request through admission help desk/admission mail id. Based on the request, the application is transferred to the interested department without collecting the application fee again. The applications of candidate who have submitted through the portal will be sent automatically to department concerned for scrutiny and selection process. The admission coordinator of the department concerned scrutinizes the applications based on the eligibility criteria in the portal itself and generates the accepted list and rejected list from among the submitted applications. The overall rank list is created from the accepted list as per the % of marks. The communal rank list is also generated based on the % of marks and community. The selected list is then generated based on the communal roster as per the norms of the government and the same was uploaded in the university website. The intimation is given to the selected candidates and informed to pay the admission fee through the portal itself.
